WELCOME TO GLASGOW

Glasgow is the largest city in Scotland and the third largest in the UK. It is also the creative capital of Europe and in recent years has held the Commonwealth Games, World Championship Gymnastics and the World Pipe Band Championships. Glasgow is also home to the Glasgow Hydro, a fantastic venue that hosts national and international music mega stars as well as global entertainment and sporting events.

Glasgow is very close to some of the most beautiful countryside in the United Kingdom. Within an hour you can drive to Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park or Edinburgh, or you can fly to London or Dublin. Within a few hours you can drive to Glencoe or Cairngorm National Park, where you can ski, hillwalk, climb or cycle. Glasgow also has fantastic museums, art galleries and public parks as well as some great places to eat.

Insurance

Before travelling to Glasgow, we recommend you purchase insurance to cover the cost of your personal property while you are travelling and while you are living in Scotland.

Endsleigh Student Insurance is endorsed by the National Union of Students and have insurance policies tailored towards student lifestyles. Accidents do happen so it is better to be covered for any eventuality.



ARRIVING IN GLASGOW

City of Glasgow College will make every effort to welcome first time international students at Glasgow airport and travel with you to your accommodation. We advise that you arrive between 0900 and 1600 Monday to Friday so we can do our best to meet you.

If you are a Tier 4 Student and this is your first time travelling to the UK then you can access our Airport Pick Up Service, please complete our airport pick up form and we will contact you to arrange.

Alternatively you can make your own way by taxi (it will cost approximately £15 to Glasgow City) or bus (£7) to your destination.

What to bring

Money

It is a good idea to have some pounds sterling with you when you arrive in Glasgow, you may need money for a taxi or a bus, for food or even accommodation. We recommend you bring with you £250 in British currency as well as your credit card or bank card.

Clothing

Scotland has changeable weather and we advise you to bring clothing to suit all occasions. We recommend cold-weather clothes for winter and a waterproof jacket. Lighter clothing is recommended for the summer months.

ACCOMMODATION

College Student Accommodation

We strongly advise that you arrange your accommodation before traveling to the UK.

Our student accommodation is located at our Riverside Campus and St Luke's Terrace. The Halls are within the college grounds, and afford some breath-taking views of the city centre, within a contemporary student environment. Both offer excellent rooms and the latest in modern facilities.

The student accommodation at Riverside and St Luke's both have single and double rooms available with en-suite bathrooms and shared kitchen/living facilities.

Private Halls

As an alternative to our student accommodation, there are many privately-run halls near the college. Specifically tailored for students, they're easily accessible and within walking distance from our campuses. You can find out more in our handy Student Accommodation Guide.

All rooms are fully furnished with optional internet packages and en-suite facilities. There's also an on-site laundry, management office, 24-hour caretaker, CCTV and secure door entry system. Before you sign on the dotted line, here are a few things to remember:

- You can either live in a single en-suite room and share a kitchen, or rent a flat on your own.
- It's usually cheaper to share.
- Prices can vary, so examine all your options.
- Rent usually includes utilities, so check if this is the case.
- Typical costs are £80-120 per week for a single en-suite bedroom. Usual fees, terms and conditions apply.



Flats and houses

If you have a group of friends, you can share a flat or house somewhere in the city. This way, you share the rent, food and utility bills. This type of accommodation can often be more affordable than other alternatives.

There are a number of ways to find property with a private landlord. Some landlords manage the letting process themselves; while others use letting agents to help them rent and maintain their property. Regular ads for flats and bedsits can also be found in local newspapers such as The Herald, Daily Record and Evening Times.

Council Tax

Council Tax is a tax that pays for local services and water in the UK. Most full-time International Students will not pay Council Tax. However, there are some students who will not qualify for an exemption. Please contact the International Student Engagement Officer to find out more.

Council tax exemption – You will be exempt from paying council tax if you fall into the following categories:

- A full-time student who studies for 21 hours or more per week for at least 24 weeks or;
- A student under the age of 20 years old studying for 12 hours or more a week for at least 3 months.



IMMIGRATION REGULATIONS

Registration at City of Glasgow College

On your first day you should report to our International Team at Riverside. Ask for them at reception, or contact them on: **0141 375 5274 / 5275 / 5282** or **international@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk**

If you are on a Tier 4 Visa, you should bring your original documents such as qualifications, IELTS, and your passport to the International Office. The International Office will process your paperwork and give you some essential information about your Biometric Residence Permit (BRP).

Students on other types of Visas should ensure to send a scanned copy of their visa to student services email: **international@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk**.

If your visa status changes during course of study you must notify the college as soon as possible.

Once you have registered with the International Office, you will be enrolled by the lecturer on your course. You will receive your timetable, essential course information and your student card within the first two weeks.

It is also a good idea to visit the Students' Association on your first day at college to find out about the sports clubs, societies and events that are available to you.

TIER 4 Student Requirements

City of Glasgow College has a 'Tier 4 Sponsor Licence' awarded by the UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI) Office. This means that we take our immigration responsibilities very seriously. We comply with attendance monitoring and absence reporting as well as checking that you have the necessary documentation and permission allowing you to undertake study in the UK.

We require you to take your responsibilities seriously too. This means that you will need to:-

- collect your BRP (if applicable) within ten days of arriving in the UK
- register at the appointed time
- provide appropriate documents, eg passport and UK biometric ID card
- attend your course and if you can't attend even for a day contact the International Office at **international@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk** to tell us why you are absent and the likely duration of your absence
- update us of any changes to your circumstances e.g. a change of address or phone number

Employment

If you applied for your Tier 4 Visa after August 3rd 2015, your passport vignette or Biometric Residence Permit will say 'No Work' and you must not work in the UK while you are studying.

If you are in the UK on a short-term study visa, your passport sticker or the stamp in your passport will say 'No work' or 'Work prohibited'. This means that you are not allowed to:

- take paid employment
- take unpaid employment
- do a work placement, even if it is part of your course

If you are on another leave to remain status, you may have different work permissions. Please check with the International Office at:

HEALTH CARE IN THE UK

NHS Treatment - Tier 4 Visa Students

If you are studying a full time course, you will qualify for free NHS treatment from the beginning of your stay until one month after your course ends. However, if you have paid the immigration health surcharge, then your entitlement will continue until the end of your stay. If you bring your married or civil partner they, as well as any children under the age of 16 (or 19 if they are in full-time education), will be entitled to the same NHS treatment as yourself. (UKCISA 2015)

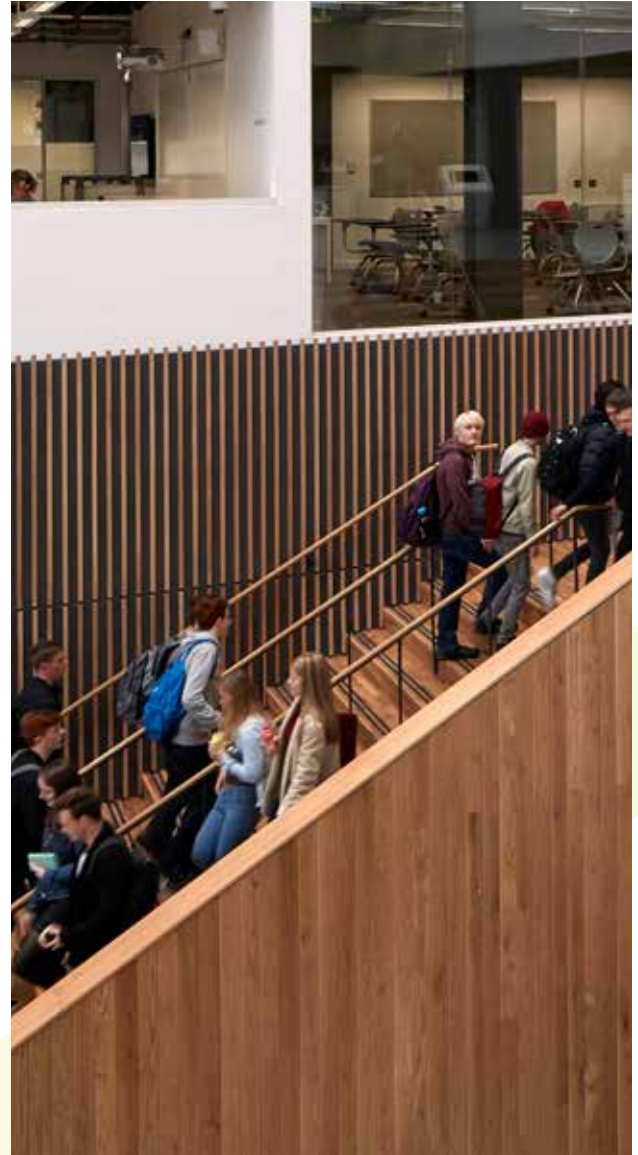
You should register with your local Doctor as you may you need medical care while you are in Scotland. You can get a letter from the International Student Engagement Officer to help with this process.

Non Tier 4 Visa Students Student Visitors & Short-term students

If you are not a full time student, you should take out private medical insurance to cover you if you become unwell or injured during your stay.

Dentist

Dental treatment is not free of charge so when registering with a dentist it is a good idea to choose a dentist who treats NHS patients as the cost for treatment will be lower than if you were to be treated as a private patient.

The College has a dedicated team of learning support tutors (Learning Support) that can help you with:-

- English language
- study skills
- report writing
- computer skills and numeracy
- We can also loan you some equipment to help with your studies.

You can meet with a Learning Support tutor to discuss a particular topic that you wish to improve on to help you resolve an academic difficulty or to develop strategies for study. This may be for referencing, numeracy, mind mapping, managing time, or any other reason.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Banks

There are many banks in Glasgow. The main Scottish banks are: The Bank of Scotland, The Royal Bank of Scotland, The Clydesdale Bank and TSB Bank.

To open an account, you need your passport, evidence of your current course of study and evidence of your address. The International Student Engagement Officer can help you to open a bank account. Ask at the Riverside Students' Association Office for further information.

Post Office

Post Offices are open Monday-Friday 0900-1700. You will find some open on a Saturday from 0900-1230 but not all. Postage rates are calculated based on weight, size and the service you require. Ask at the Riverside Students' Association Office for information.

Libraries

City of Glasgow College has two well resources libraries; the Riverside and City Campus libraries are open Monday - Thursday from 8.30am - 7.30pm and on Friday's from 8.30am - 5.00pm.

You will find out more about the college resources in your induction.

Glasgow also has great public libraries in most communities and The Mitchell Library at Charing Cross is the largest public reference library in Europe. For more information visit: www.glasgowlife.org.uk

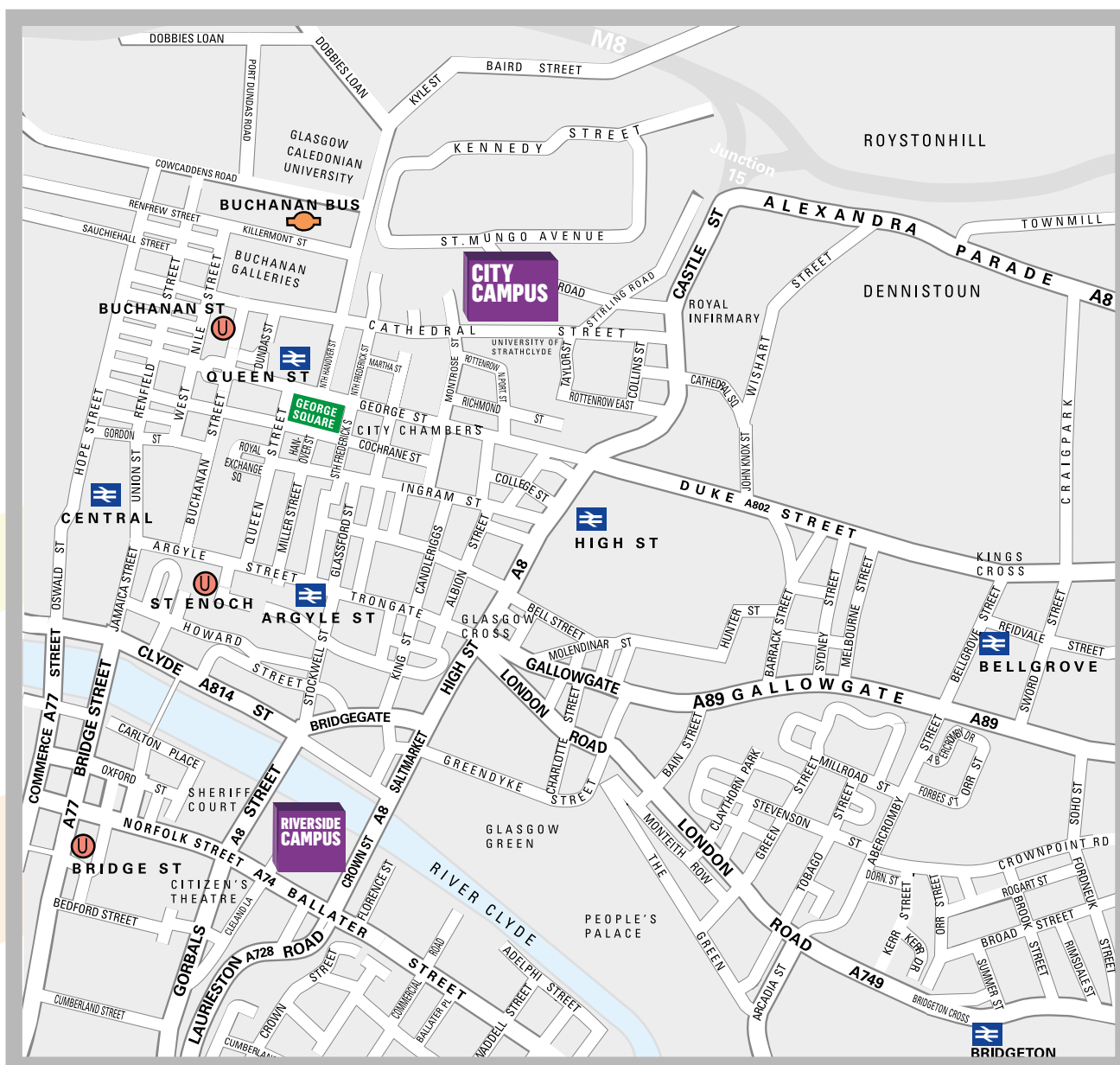
