HOW TO APPLY

HOW TO APPLY



Applying to City of Glasgow College is easy. For courses starting in August/September online applications will open in January and for courses starting in January online applications will open in October.

Our course information pages tell you what the minimum entry requirements are for each course. Our admissions procedures aim to treat everyone who applies fairly so, if you meet the entry qualifications for the course, and we have places available, we'll offer you an interview. Our professional and supportive teaching staff will guide you through the interview process and selection will be based on your performance at interview and any other selection criteria where appropriate.

What if I'm applying for more than one course?

List your choices in order of preference - we'll start with your first choice when considering your application. If this is unsuccessful, or the course is full, we'll move on to your second choice. This gives everyone a better chance of securing their first choice course.

What if I can't apply online?

We can help you complete a paper application. You can call Student Services on 0141 375 5191 or alternatively, pop in to see us at our City Campus or email:

applications@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk

What happens when I apply?

When you apply online you'll be asked to complete a simple registration process to create your account. You'll need a current email and we'll use this to contact you throughout the admissions process. Once you've set this up, you can:

- Complete the application form.
- Book an interview date and time.
- View your course choices.
- · Accept or decline any offers.
- Pre Enrol.

I've booked my interview what happens now?

You'll receive an email confirming the date, time and location, plus what you'll need to bring, e.g. a copy of your qualifications. For design courses, you might also be asked to bring a portfolio or examples of your work.

What else should I know about the interview?

We've a limited number of places on each course and only offer interview times if there are still places available. This means that you may need to wait for an interview date if we're still processing the outcomes of previous interviews.

Also because we make offers as we go along, the course might be full by the time you attend. If this happens we'll make every effort to let you know before you attend for interview. However, more interview dates sometimes become available if people don't turn up or do not accept their offer. Please bear this in mind - we'll progress your application in date order and as quickly as we can.

What happens next?

If you get a place on your first choice course, we'll automatically cancel your second choice to give others a chance. If your first choice course is full, we'll let you know and put you on the waiting list. We'll then progress your second choice and let you know the decision on each choice. If both your choices are full, we may offer you an alternative course. Sometimes if a course is full and you've had a successful interview we may offer you a reserve place. This means that you're at the top of the list if someone else drops out.

So what should I do after receiving my offer?

Once you receive an offer, you must accept or decline within two weeks. If we don't hear from you, we'll cancel the offer. If you want to cancel or withdraw your application at any time, please contact Student Services on 0141 375 5191 or applications@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk

When you accept your Definite Offer you can then Pre Enrol.

What if I change my mind?

If you no longer want your place, or want to change to another course area, contact us immediately. Please don't make any more applications - this may delay your progress.

How will I know if I'm not successful?

If you don't meet the entry requirements for a course, we'll let you know. We may offer you an alternative course, or invite you for an interview to discuss your options. If you meet the entry requirements but don't receive any offers, we'll also put you in touch with our Careers Advisors, who can advise you what to do next.

What if all my course choices are full?

If one of your course choices is full, we'll put you on the waiting list and progress your second choice. If all your course choices are full and you want to be considered for something else or need advice, please contact us.

Who should I speak to if I'm not sure about anything?

MONEY MATTERS

Most college students get financial support towards the cost of studying. For example most students do not have to pay course fees and many students receive support towards their living, travel, study and childcare expenses. The financial support you get depends on the level of course you study. The tables below show what you can apply for and who to contact.

FE FUNDING

Further Education (FE) Courses Level 6 or below on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework (see page 12)

Apply to the college for the following funding elements. Visit www.cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk

Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) - 16-17 year olds can get £30 per week depending on household income (this will be based on your parent's earnings). EMA students will also be eligible to apply for travel from the bursary fund which is not based on your parent's earnings. 16-19 year olds on a part-time FE course can apply for EMA only based on your parent's earnings.

Travel - Travel is available to all eligible students who live 2 miles from their campus. We pay for the cheapest mode of transport and will assess your travel costs using your postcode noted on your funding application form.

Help for Students with a Disability - If you need help because of a disability you may be eligible for additional support from the bursary fund e.g. help with the cost of private transport (taxi).

Further Education Bursary - This is the main source of help with living expenses, travel and study costs for those over 18 years old. This award is means tested (based on household income i.e. parental/partner earnings) and how much you receive will also depend on your age and personal circumstances.

HE FUNDING

Higher Education (HE) Courses Level 7 or above on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework

Apply to the Student Awards Agency for Scotland for the following funding elements. Visit www.saas.gov.uk

Fees - Most Scottish students studying in Scotland don't need to pay tuition fees, but you'll need to apply to SAAS for them to be paid to the College. If you don't apply to SAAS or leave your course before 1st December you'll need to pay the fees yourself and the College will send you an invoice.

Independent Students Bursary - this is a grant of £875 for independent students where household income is below £17,000. You're considered independent if you're over 25 or if you're under 25 and have supported yourself financially for more than three years. It's based on household income and doesn't need to be paid back.

Disabled Students Allowance - if you have a disability, learning difficulty or mental health condition that impacts on your learning you could be eligible for additional help. This could help towards the cost of special equipment, non-medical personal help or a basic allowance for learning support. If you think you're eligible contact our Learning Support Team.

Young Student Bursary - This is a grant of up to $\mathfrak{L}1,875$ for students under 25 where household income is below $\mathfrak{L}34,000$. It's based on your parent/guardian's income and doesn't need to be paid back.

Lone Parent Grant / Dependant Grant / Care Experienced Student's Bursary - these are additional grants and don't need to be paid back. If you're a lone parent or live with a dependant adult, SAAS can award an extra grant to help you. If you're care experienced you can apply for a full grant of £7625.

Student Loan - You don't have to take out a Student Loan but it's the main source of living expenses for most students. You'll only repay the loan after you've left college or university and are earning more than £17,775.

The following funds are available from the College:


Childcare Fund Support - The priority groups for childcare support are lone parents and low income families (this can be evidenced by Working Tax Credits). Students studying full-time or part-time vocational programmes can apply. Support from the fund is discretionary and only open to eligible students to meet the costs of formal/registered childcare. The childcare fund is cash limited and it is advisable to apply early to ensure funding is available.

Hardship Funds - These funds can help you if you're likely to experience financial hardship while at College. Funds are limited so you should apply early. Awards are based on an assessment of your income and expenditure and are made at the discretion of the college.

Support For Learning - In addition to the Disabled Students Allowance offered by SAAS the college can offer practical support with equipment, etc.

LEARNING SUPPORT



Do you have a disability, health condition or additional support need? Do you have social, emotional or behavioural difficulties that could impact on your time at college? We are here to help! The first step is letting us know.

Every student has individual needs, so we will tailor support to meet your requirements. You can discuss your particular needs with a member of the team and have this recorded in your **Personal Learning Support Plan (PLSP)**.

HOW CAN THE COLLEGE SUPPORT ME?

The support we offer students includes:

- Sign language interpreters.

- Education Support Workers (for example, to read, scribe and note-take for you).
- Equipment loan (including laptops and digital voice recorders).
- Adaptation of teaching, learning or assessment materials.
- Workshops or one-to-one support in Study Skills, English Language support, basic ICT, basic literacy and numeracy etc.
- Alternative exam or assessment arrangements.
- Help with applying for Disabled Students Allowance (HNC/D).

Entry Requirements (non EU)


To be offered a place on a course at City of Glasgow College, you must demonstrate that you meet the entry requirements for the programme you wish to study. We ask that your qualification is at an equivalent level to the required Scottish qualification. In addition, you may need to prove English proficiency by submitting an IELTS for UKVI Academic test certificate. Our International team is experienced in dealing with international qualifications and can answer any questions you may have.



There are a number of key benefits which a Modern Apprenticeship can offer you including:

In addition, you will achieve core skills in Communication, Numeracy, Information Technology, Problem Solving and Working with Others.



- Once you've finished your course, you have the option to move onto a higher level course:
 - NC/NQ Apply for relevant HNC/HND courses at our college.
 - HNC/D Apply for degree level courses.
- Alternatively, you can go into related employment. Full details on opportunities available after you've completed your course are available on our website.
- This prospectus provides a summarised version of all our full time courses - further information can be found on our website or you can email the contact provided at the end of each course.

BUILT ENVIRONMENT NC

(SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

This course will prepare you for an entry level technician position in the construction industry or further study.

You'll receive all the basic knowledge and skills you need. Although mainly theory based, the course includes site visits to help place your learning in context.

This 6 month course starts August & January.

Minimum entry requirements

- Three National 5 qualifications at Grade C or above including English, Mathematics and a Science subject;

The course will enable candidates to achieve the HND Nautical Science and Chief Mate and Master Certification (by SQA examination route).

You'll also have completed the following short courses: HELM Management, NAEST Management and a Medical Care Certificate.

Minimum entry requirements

- Minimum=12 months sea service as a Watch Keeping Deck Officer whilst holding a UK MCA 'Officer of the Watch' Unlimited Certificate of Competency. NAEST (M) certificate (to be valid when finally applying for your COC)
- One of the following:
- ECDIS Certificate, issued in compliance with IMO Model Course 1.27 as amended, accepted by the MCA and approved by the Administration/State of an IMO 'White List' Country.
- MCA approved NARAS

MARINE ELECTRO-TECHNOLOGY (Cadetship) HND (SCQF Level 8)


Course overview

Cadets successfully completing this programme will have gained Maritime & Coastguard Agency's ETO Certificate of Competency. The course is split into 5 phases - 3 at college and 2 at sea.

Minimum entry requirements

- Four National 5 qualifications including Maths, English and a Science based subject or English equivalent plus two Highers one of which must be Maths/Physical Science subject or English equivalent; OR
- NC Shipping and Maritime Operations (SCQF Level 6) with optional Engineering Units.
- Alternative qualifications will be considered on an individual basis in conjunction with the sponsoring company or training provider.



The course consists of two elements - HND Nautical Science which is delivered during the first and second college phases and covers all the units in the SQA Group Award at SCQF Level 8. PDA in Marine Management is a management award at SCQF Level 9, which gives you the opportunity to develop your analytical and critical thinking skills. These combine to give you an SPD award.

Minimum entry requirements

- One or more passes at Higher/A Level amounting to at least 120 points on the UCAS tariff system. One of which should be Maths or a Physical Science subject.




