Charitable Fundraising	<ul> <li>The Executive Committee continue to be active with our 'SA on Campus' events which take place on both campuses and in the evening to ensure that we can engage with as many different groups of students as possible.</li> <li>The Students' Association raised £394.69 at our charity event on World Mental Health Day which was split between PTSD UK and See Me.</li> <li>The Executive Committee have voted to adopt See Me as our charity of the year to coincide with the work we are doing around student mental health.</li> <li>The Students' Association have also given £747.95 to events students who are running charitable events as part of their course. We will be recording the amount of money these students raise in order to measure the impact of this funding.</li> <li>Our 'Raise It' charity introduced the 'Sock It' initiative where 140 socks, filled with essential items for those affected by homelessness, were donated for the Lodging House Mission</li> </ul>

Executive Committee Training	<ul> <li>As part of the continued development of our Executive Committee, we are planning to develop a module on Moodle which will help to build the independence and capacity by making information about how to effectively perform their roles easily accessible.</li> </ul>

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Green Impact	<ul> <li>NUS are set to launch the new guidance for Green Impact Colleges soon and we are looking forward to taking part and earning our first Green Impact Award.</li> <li>The bottle swap campaign started in December 2018 where students are encouraged to swap their disposable water bottles for reusable bottles and 5,000 will be distributed to our students.</li> </ul>
Quality Students' Unions	<ul> <li>The Students' Association have confirmed that we will take part in the first ever cohort of Scottish colleges aiming to achieve the Quality Students' Unions Award.</li> <li>We expect to begin this work early in 2019 once NUS have launched the new criteria.</li> </ul>
Student Partnership Agreement	<ul> <li>The first round of student ideas for the Student Partnership Agreement were gathered in October 2018.</li> <li>The first topic, linked to Aim 6 of the Learning Experience Strategy, was:         <ul> <li>What can the college do to help you stay motivated and support your own wellbeing?</li> <li>Think of the services the college already provides, do you think these could be promoted differently? Consider what you already do yourself to stay focused on your studies, could this be shared with other students?</li> </ul> </li> <li>From the first meeting of the City Partnership Forum there were agreements made that the College would look at the usage of open classrooms and the Students' Association would address greater provision of social events and investigate discounted parking for students.</li> </ul>
