
2 Purpose of Paper

This report provides an overview of ONE CITY the College's annual continuing professional development programme which is scheduled for the 18th June 2019 and for w/c 19th August 2019.

3 Strategic Context and Key Points

ONE CITY 2019 will take place in 2 phases this year on is June and second event at the start of the new academic year.

June 2019

The purpose of the event is to assist the College to engage and will consist –

An Audience with Graeme Obree – Graeme Obree was one of the UK's top cyclists. Graeme Obree recounts having a difficult childhood where he experienced bullying and low self-esteem.

During an eventful career, he twice broke the prestigious world hour record (1993 and 1994) and became World Champion for the 4Km pursuit in 1993 and 1995. He was also well known for his innovative approach to bike design and aerodynamics. He invented new positions to gain the maximum aerodynamic advantage. His

successful cycling career was undertaken against a backdrop of personal turmoil, in which he suffered periods of depression.

Lunch and Engage - This is an opportunity to develop appreciation of staff, facilitating communication, and promoting workplace relationships. A study by Sociometric Solutions found that employees that sat together at a group lunch were 36% more likely to interact with each other later that day.

August 2019
