A walk in the woods turns nasty in HND student Cameron Thom's short drama which won 'Best Film' at the Scottish Youth Film Festival.

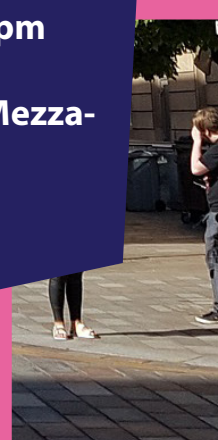

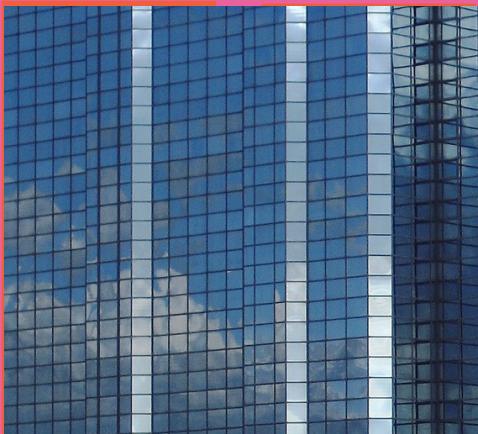
