Background...

To celebrate the diversity of its student and staff population, the College has again held the Embracing Diversity Student Competition.

The competition aimed to find the most effective expression or communication of the "embracing diversity" theme and all students were encouraged to take part regardless of their course area.

The primary objective of the competition was to raise awareness of a complex concept and promote social justice, legislative compliance and potential cultural change amongst both students and staff, as part of the learning and teaching experience. In essence, the competition had real human interest, affecting individuals in a way that simply discussing legislation, or diversity and equalities in general could not.

At the Education Scotland Inspection, in May 2012, the Embracing Diversity Competition was identified as being an example of sector leading and innovative practice.

Ruth was elected Conservative MSP for Glasgow in May 2011, and became party leader in November of the same year.

In 2012, Ruth won Stonewall's Politician of the Year award for her commitment to diversity and equalities.

For most of her adult life Ruth has lived and worked in Glasgow and her parents are both proud Glaswegians. Ruth's father used to play for Partick Thistle so, apart from politics, sport has always been an important part of her life.

Prior to her election, Ruth worked as a presenter, a news journalist and a documentary maker, mostly with BBC Scotland and REAL Radio in Glasgow.

Outside of work and politics, Ruth is an avid sports fan. She enjoys hillwalking, kickboxing and is a fully paid up member of the official Scotland Supporters' Club, attending all the home games at Hampden.

Ruth was in the Territorial Army for nearly three years but had to leave after a severe injury sustained in a training exercise. She was also a Sunday School teacher and has undertaken voluntary work including time with a radio station for the blind.
