Background...

In its third year, the Embracing Diversity Competition 2014 aimed to find the most effective expression of the "embracing diversity" theme and all students were encouraged to take part regardless of their course area.

The primary driving force of the competition was to encourage students and staff to reflect upon what diversity and equalities meant to them as part of the learning and teaching experience, and to creatively consider and communicate:

- Fairness, through challenging discrimination and inequalities.
- Opportunity, though advancing fairness and social justice.
- Respect, through tackling prejudice and promoting understanding.

In essence, the competition had real human interest, affecting individuals in a way that simply discussing legislation or diversity and equalities in general could not.

Outside of work and politics, Ruth is an avid sports fan. She enjoys hillwalking, kickboxing and is a fully paid up member of the official Scotland Supporters' Club, attending all the home games at Hampden.

Ruth was in the Territorial Army for nearly three years but had to leave after a severe injury sustained in a training exercise. She was also a Sunday School teacher and has undertaken voluntary work including time with a radio station for blind people.

- School Level, Winner £100


The respective Curriculum Directors of each represented School announced the categories and presented the prizes to the winners of their School category.




