HOW TO APPLY

Applying to City of Glasgow College is easy. For courses starting in August/September online applications will open in January and for courses starting in January online applications will open in October. Our course information pages tell you what the minimum entry requirements are for each course.

Our admissions procedures aim to treat everyone who applies fairly so, if you meet the entry qualifications for the course, and we have places available, we'll offer you an interview. Our professional and supportive teaching staff will guide you through the interview process and selection will be based on your performance at interview and any other selection criteria where appropriate.

Can I apply for more than one course?

Choose up to 2 courses and list your choices in order of preference — we'll start with your first choice when considering your application. If this is unsuccessful, or the course is full, we'll move on to your second choice. This gives everyone a better chance of securing their first choice course.

What do I need to apply?

You'll be asked to complete a simple registration process to create your account. You'll need a current email and we'll use this to contact you throughout the admissions process. Once you've set this up, you can:

- Complete the application form.
- Book an interview date and time (Interviews will begin from February for August start courses).
- View your course choices.
- Accept or decline any offers.
- Pre-Enrol.

You'll be asked a number of questions when completing your application, such as:

- If you are a UK National and have lived in Scotland all your life - This helps us determine what your eligibility might be for course fees and funding.
- Qualifications you have or are working towards - If you don't have the minimum entry requirements we'll refer your application to the Curriculum Team to decide whether to progress with your application. Therefore, ensure you include relevant work experience and a personal statement.
- Applicants whose first language is not English should have minimum ESOL Intermediate level 2 or equivalent.
- Personal statement - This is so that you can, in your own words, tell us a bit about yourself, why your chosen

course(s) interest you and why you're suitable for the course(s). We recommend that you prepare your personal statement in advance, then simply paste it into the application form.

- We'll ask you to disclose any disability for example a mental health condition, learning difficulty or physical impairment. Your answers are treated confidentially and will be shared with our Learning Support team who'll contact you to discuss support needs (if you have been made an offer).
- You'll also be asked about whether you are care experienced, or have responsibilities as a young carer. Your answers are treated confidentially and will be shared with our Student Advisors who will provide a named advisor for you to contact for help.

What if I can't apply online?

We can help you complete a paper application. Call Student Services on 0141 375 5191.

So I've booked my interview, what happens now?

You'll receive an email confirming the date, time and location, plus what you'll need to bring, e.g. a copy of your qualifications. For design courses, you might also be asked to show a portfolio or examples of your work. If you cannot attend your interview, contact Student Services.

What else should I know about the interview?

We've only a limited number of places on each course and we only offer interview times if there are still places available. This means that you may need to wait for an interview date if we're still processing the outcomes of previous interviews. Also because we make offers as we go along, the course might be full by the time you attend. If this happens we'll make every effort to let you know before you attend interview.

However, more interview dates sometimes become available if people don't turn up or do not accept their offer. Please bear this in mind — we'll progress your application in date order and as quickly as we can.

What happens next?

If you get a place on your first choice course, we'll automatically cancel your second choice when you accept your offer to give others a chance. If your first choice course is full, we'll let you know and put you on the waiting list. We'll then progress to your second choice and let you know the decision on each choice. If both your choices are full, we

may offer you an alternative course.

Sometimes if a course is full and you've had a successful interview we may offer you a reserve place. This means that you're top of the list if someone else drops out.

So what should I do after receiving my offer?

Once you receive an offer, you must accept or decline within two weeks. If we don't hear from you, we'll cancel the offer.

When you accept your Definite Offer you can then Pre Enrol. Induction information will be sent to you 4-6 weeks before the course starts.

What if I change my mind?

If you no longer want your place, or wish to change to another course area, contact us immediately.

How will I know if I'm not successful?

If you don't meet the entry requirements for a course, we'll let you know. We may offer you an alternative course, or invite you for an interview to discuss your options. If you meet the entry requirements but don't receive any offers, we'll also put you in touch with our Careers Advisors, who'll advise you what to do next.

What if all my course choices are full?

If one of your course choices is full, we'll put you on the waiting list and progress your second choice. If all your course choices are full and you want to be considered for something else or need advice, please contact us.

MONEY MATTERS

Most college students get financial support towards the cost of studying. For example, most students do not have to pay course fees and many students receive support towards their living

FE FUNDING

Further Education (FE) Courses Level 6 or below on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework.

Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) – 16-17 year olds can get £30 per week depending on household income.

Further Education Bursary – main source of help with living expenses, travel and study costs for those over 18 years of age. How much you receive is based on your age and house income.

Care Experienced Bursary – this is available for students who have been in local authority care.

Travel - Travel is available to all eligible students who live 2 miles from their campus.

Help for Students with a Disability - If you need help because of a disability you may be eligible for additional support from the bursary fund e.g. help with the cost of private transport (taxi).

HE FUNDING

Higher Education (HE) Courses Level 7 or above on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework.

Students apply to the Student Awards Agency Scotland (SAAS). For more detailed information, please visit their website www.saas.gov.uk. You can apply for:

Fees – SAAS will pay fees for most Scottish domiciled students but you must apply.

Independent Students Bursary - This is a grant of £1,000 for independent students where household income is below £17,000.

Young Student Bursary - A grant of up to £2,000 for students under 25 where household income is below

expenses. The financial support you get depends on the level of course you study. For more detailed information, please visit our website www.cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk.

£34,000. It's based on your parent/guardian's income and doesn't need to be paid back.

Student Loan - You don't have to take out a Student Loan but it's the main source of living expenses for most students. You'll only repay the loan after you've left college or university and are earning more than £18,935.

Care Experienced Bursary- This is a grant of £8,100 for students who have been in care at some point in their lives. There is no Student Loan for these students.

Lone Parent Grant / Dependant Grant - These are additional grants and don't need to be paid back. If you're a lone parent or live with a dependant adult, SAAS can award an extra grant to help you.

Disabled Students Allowance (DSA) - If you are disabled and meet the eligibility criteria, our Learning Support Team can assess your needs and submit an application on your behalf.

OTHER FUNDS

AVAILABLE AT COLLEGE

Childcare Fund – help for students with dependent children in formal/registered childcare. The priority groups for childcare support are lone parents and low income families.

Hardship Funds – help for students who might experience financial hardship while at college.

Support For Learning - in addition to the Disabled Students Allowance offered by SAAS the college can offer practical support with equipment etc.

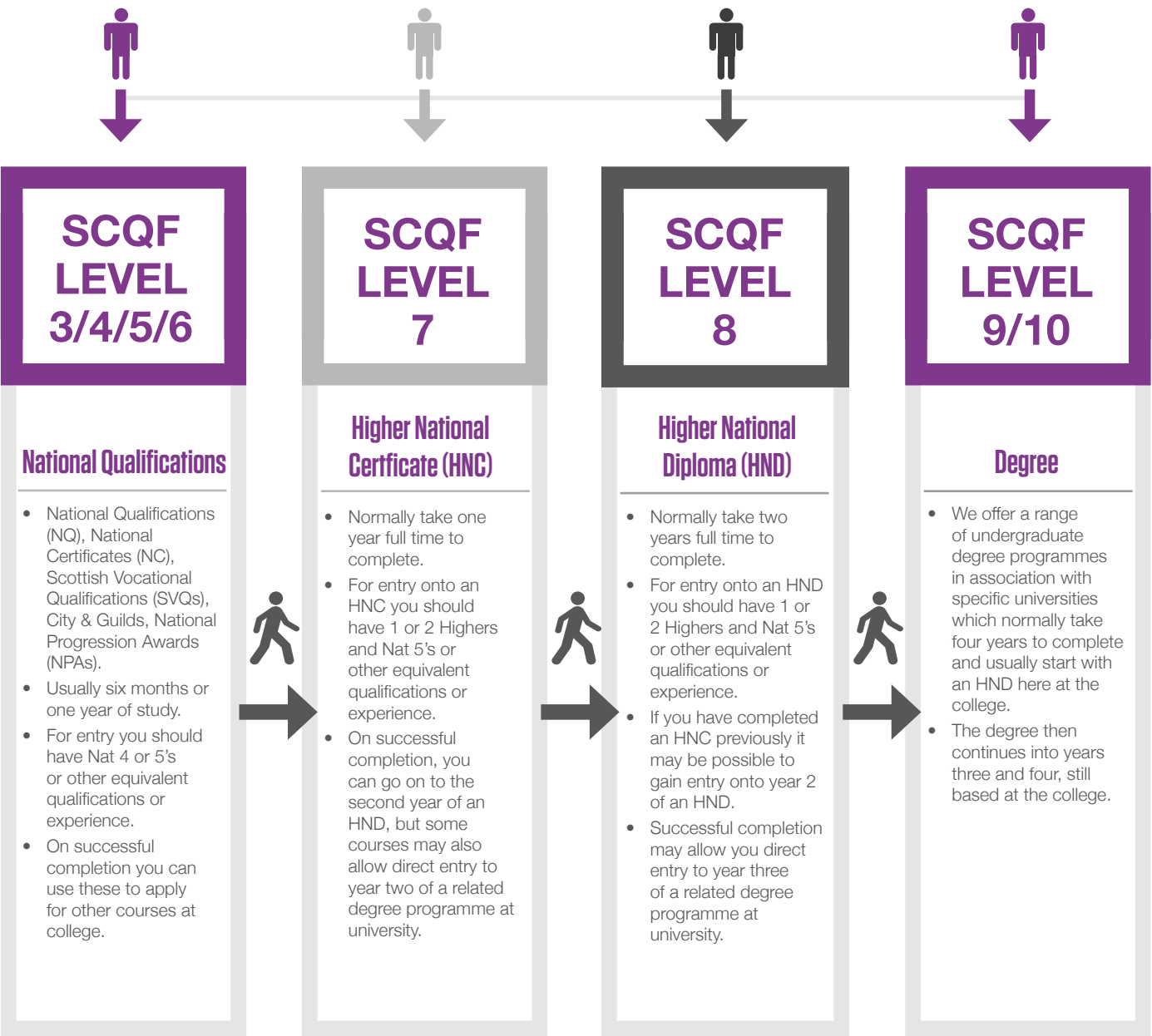

- Some HND courses accept students direct into 2nd year of the HND - full details can be found on our website.
- Once you've finished your course, you have the option to move onto a higher level course:
 - NC/NQ - Apply for relevant HNC/HND courses at our college.
 - HNC/D - Apply for degree level courses.
- Alternatively, you can go into related employment. Full details on career opportunities available after you've completed your course are available on our website.
- This prospectus provides a summarised version of all our full time courses - further information can be found on our website or you can email the contact provided at the end of each course.
- This prospectus details the minimum entry requirements for courses. However, there are some courses which have additional selection requirements, i.e. practical assessments, portfolio, audition. Check our website for the most up to date entry requirements.
- If you meet the minimum entry requirements (and there are still places available) you will be invited for a group and/or individual interview where you will have the opportunity to find out more about the course and tell us why you are interested in this subject area.
- If you intend to apply for a course at university after completing your college course please check individual university entry requirements as they may need additional Highers and/or qualifications as well as an HNC/HND from college.

Course overview

This is a practical, project-based course that will allow you to explore a range of mediums including creative and technical skills in printmaking, drawing, photography and digital design in practical workshops, computer labs and educational visits.

Minimum entry requirements

- Two National 4 qualifications in English and Art or Graphic Communication; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

CREATIVE PRINTMAKING HND (SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This course offers you the opportunity to develop your creative talents through the use of traditional and contemporary printmaking, diverse drawing processes and digital media. You will explore key printmaking techniques and media supplemented by technical and creative skills in digital media, drawing and mixed media as well as contextual studies.

Minimum entry requirements

- Higher Art and Design at Grade C or above AND National 5 English at Grade C or above; OR
- NC/NQ qualification in Print, Art and Design, Graphic Design or Illustration; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

ART & DESIGN: FINE ART PORTFOLIO NQ

(SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

This is an introduction to the study of fine art and gives you the opportunity to build up a rich and varied portfolio of work. The course will help you develop key practical artistic skills and will help enhance your understanding of contemporary art in general. You will be encouraged to develop your creativity and your awareness of specialist skills and techniques, taking ownership of your own unique creative voice.

Minimum entry requirements

- National 5 Art and Design and National 5 English at Grade C or above; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

FINE ART HNC

(SCQF Level 7)

Course overview

This course includes both traditional and innovative art practices. It gives you a broad visual education in contemporary art practice. You'll develop your skills in a range of specialist disciplines and increase your awareness and knowledge of conceptual thinking. It also gives you the opportunity to develop and strengthen a portfolio of artwork.

Minimum entry requirements

- Higher Art and Higher English at Grade C or above AND two National 4 qualifications; OR
- NQ Art and Design; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

FINE ART HND Year 2 Direct Entry

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This stimulating and creative course includes both traditional and innovative practices. It will give you a broad visual education in contemporary art practice. You'll develop your skills in a range of specialist disciplines and increase your awareness and knowledge of conceptual thinking. It also offers an opportunity to develop individual practice in relation to your own interests.

Minimum entry requirements

- HNC Fine Art or equivalent.

CONTEMPORARY ART PRACTICE BA (HONS)

(SCQF Level 9)

Course overview

This is a practice-based degree, where you'll have opportunities to explore two and three-dimensional art as well as lens-based and digital disciplines. You'll have opportunities through your studies for professional placements in the arts and for curation and self-promotion. Critical thinking and writing are also central to the course. This course is delivered by the City of Glasgow College and validated by the University of the West of Scotland.

Minimum entry requirements

- HND in Contemporary Art Practice (or equivalent) with a good pass in the graded unit; OR
- Relevant professional experience.

You must also meet the general admission requirements of the University and apply via UCAS.

PHOTOGRAPHY NQ

(SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

If you're interested in learning about photography, then the NQ Photography course is the perfect starting point. It allows you to develop a wide variety of skills in a range of very hands-on projects, in photographic studios, on location and in a traditional black and white darkroom.

You'll have access to new, well-resourced photographic studios and be able to develop your creative ideas using a wide variety of digital and film cameras, lighting equipment and specialist kit.

Minimum entry requirements

- Two National 5 qualifications at Grade C or above including English and a design/creative subject; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

PHOTOGRAPHY HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This practical course will allow you to expand upon your existing photographic skills and takes you beyond the basics during your first year of study, introducing a range of specialist techniques and genres which you will probably not have experienced before. During the second year, you will add to your experience, building skills and knowledge while focussing on the areas of the creative industries you might wish to work in after your studies.

Minimum entry requirements

- NC/NQ in Photography; OR
- Higher Photography at Grade C or above AND National 5 English at Grade C or above; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience AND
- A portfolio of your photographic work, both digital and printed.

PHOTOGRAPHY BA (HONS)

(SCQF Level 9/10)

Course overview

In this course you'll develop the practical and critical skills needed for a practising photographer. Guest lectures and workshop sessions are an important element, with opportunities for business, entrepreneurship and enterprise activities. A self-directed approach to your studies will allow you to tailor your portfolio towards your own photographic interests. During the fourth year of this course you'll focus on and develop your skills and knowledge towards your own photographic goals. This course is delivered by the City of Glasgow College and validated by the University of the West of Scotland.

Minimum entry requirements

- HND in Photography.
You will be interviewed and assessed on your portfolio.
- You must also meet the general admission requirements of the University and apply via UCAS.

BUILT ENVIRONMENT



BUILT ENVIRONMENT NQ (SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

Would you like to work in the construction industry in roles such as Quantity Surveyor or Architectural technician? Although mainly theory-based, the course offers practical site visits to help you place your learning in context, with opportunities found within Glasgow wherever possible. This course is a great launchpad for a career in the Construction Industry as well as an ideal starting point.

Minimum entry requirements

- Three National 5 qualifications at Grade C or above including English, Mathematics and a Science subject; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

BUILT ENVIRONMENT/CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT HNC (SCQF Level 7)

- One Higher at Grade C or above including Mathematics or a Science subject; OR
- NQ at SCQF level 6 in Built Environment; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

CONSTRUCTION TECHNICIAN WITHIN THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT HNC (SCQF Level 7)

Course overview

- One Higher at Grade C or above including Mathematics or a Science subject; OR
- National Qualification at SCQF level 6 in Built Environment; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT HND (SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

The HND Construction Management course is a technician level qualification that combines a broad-based construction-industry-specific first-year curriculum with a more specialist second-year curriculum, teaching you the skills you need for employment in this highly demanding sector.

Minimum entry requirements

- Two Highers at Grade C or above including Mathematics or a Science subject; OR
- NQ at SCQF level 6 in Built Environment; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

BUILDING SURVEYING HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This technician level qualification combines a broad-based first-year curriculum with a more specialist second-year curriculum, which will provide you with the skills required for employment in this sector.

Minimum entry requirements

Year one:

- Two Highers at Grade C or above including Mathematics or a Science subject, OR
- A National Certificate in Built Environment at SCQF level 6, OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

Year two:

- HNC Built Environment.
- It may also be possible to gain entry with an HNC in Building Surveying. This will depend on the units that have been covered in the HNC. Students who gain entry with this qualification will require a bespoke infill programme, so each application will be considered on an individual basis.

ARCHITECTURAL TECHNOLOGY HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This course gives you a technician level qualification, combining a broad first year curriculum with a specialist second year curriculum. It'll give you the skills required for employment in this high demand industry sector. You'll also have the opportunity to go on site visits around the West of Scotland to give you an understanding of contemporary relevance.

Minimum entry requirements

Year one:

- Two Highers at Grade C or above including Mathematics or a Science subject; OR
- NC in Built Environment at SCQF level 6; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

Year two:

- HNC Built Environment.
- It may also be possible to gain entry with an HNC in Architectural Technology. This will depend on the units that have been covered in the HNC. Students who gain entry with this qualification will require a bespoke infill programme, so each application will be considered on an individual basis.

COMPUTER AIDED ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This is a technician level qualification that provides a specialist curriculum focused on the application of Computer Aided Design software in a construction specific context. It is underpinned by a Construction Industry specific curriculum and will equip you with the skills required for employment in this specialist industry sector. An Architectural Technologist is a specialist in the technological aspects of building design and construction, bridging the gap between design theory and construction practice.

Minimum entry requirements

- Two Highers at Grade C or above including Mathematics, English, Graphics, Product Design or a Science subject; OR
- National Certificate at SCQF level 6 in a relevant subject area; OR
- Other equivalent qualifications or experience.

QUANTITY SURVEYING HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Quantity Surveyors seek to minimise the costs of a project and enhance value, while still achieving the required standards and quality. Many of these are specified by statutory building regulations, which the surveyor needs to understand and adhere to.

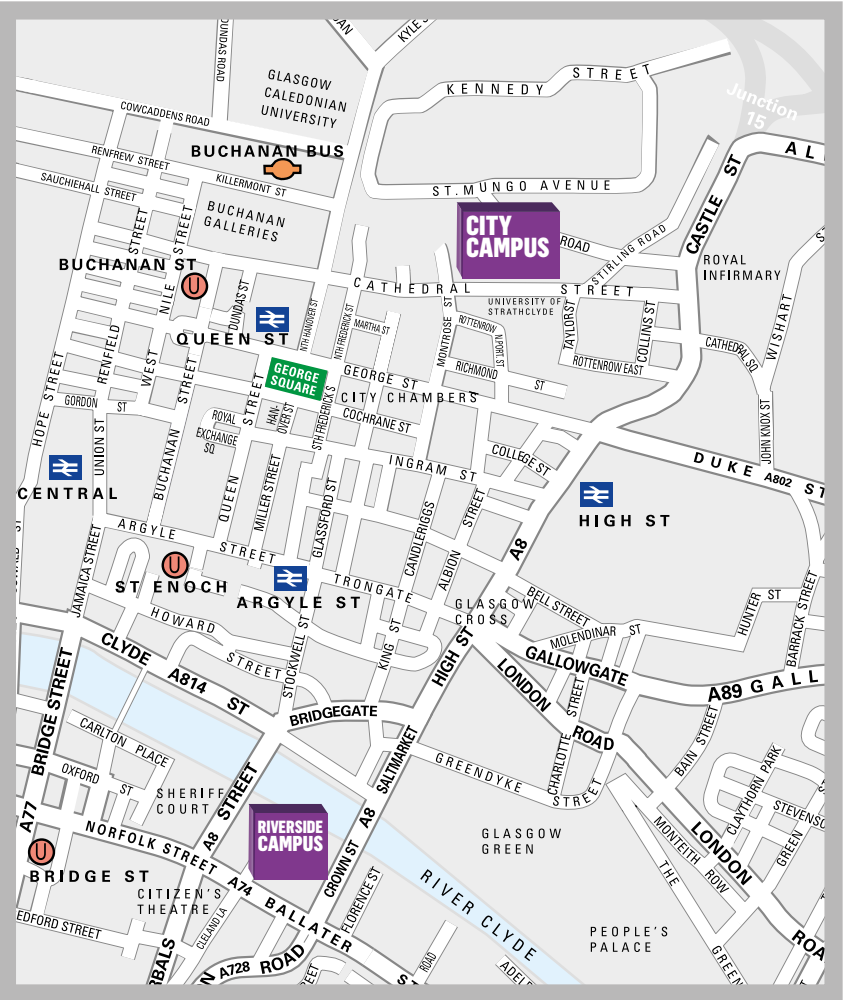
