





BUILT ENVIRONMENT NC

(SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

This course will prepare you for an entry level technician position in the construction industry or further study. You'll receive all the basic knowledge and skills you need, delivered by staff with industry experience. Although mainly theory based, the course includes site visits to help you place your learning in context.

There is a January start version of this course.

Minimum entry requirements

- Relevant group of units or courses at Intermediate Level 1 or 2 OR
- Three Standard Grade passes at Credit Level, preferably with Maths, English and a Science OR
- Three National 5 qualifications, preferably with Maths, English and a Science OR
- Relevant construction industry experience and the commitment and capacity to cope with the academic content of the course.

BUILT ENVIRONMENT HNC

(SCQF Level 7)

Course overview

This course is a technician level qualification that will provide you with the basics you'll need to enter into a career in the construction industry. It's ideal for those who want to pursue a technician level career in the industry, but haven't yet chosen a specialism. On completing the course, you can progress straight to the second year HND programme without having to do any extra units.

Minimum entry requirements

- One Higher at Grade C or above, preferably in Maths or a Science OR
- National Certificate in Built Environment, or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant construction industry experience and the commitment and capacity to cope with the academic content of the course.

HND (SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This course combines a general first year with a specialist second year curriculum. It'll give you the skills required for employment in this industry sector. You'll have the opportunity to go on site visits around the West of Scotland to give you an understanding of contemporary relevance. This is a two-year HND which accepts direct entrants to year two.

Minimum entry requirements

Year one entry:

- Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably including Maths or a Science OR
- A National Certificate in Built Environment or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant experience and the ability to show the commitment and capacity required to cope with the academic content of the course.

Year two entry:

- HNC in Construction or Built Environment OR
- It may also be possible to gain entry with an HNC in Architectural Technology, depending on the units that have been covered in the HNC. Students who gain entry with this qualification will require a bespoke infill programme, so each application will be considered on an individual basis.

Course overview

- Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably including Maths or a Science OR
- A National Certificate in Built Environment or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant construction industry experience and the ability to show the commitment and capacity needed to cope with the academic content of the course.

Year two entry:

- HNC in Construction or Built Environment OR
- It may also be possible to gain entry with an HNC in Building Surveying. Students who gain entry with this qualification will require a bespoke infill programme, so each application will be considered on an individual basis.

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

Quantity Surveyors manage all costs relating to building and civil engineering projects, from the early design plans through to completion. They seek to minimise the costs of a project and enhance value, while still achieving the required standards and quality. This technician level course combines an industry specific first year with a more specific second year, providing you the skills for employment in this sector.

Minimum entry requirements

Year one entry:

- Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably including Maths or a Science OR
- A National Certificate in Built Environment or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant construction industry experience and the ability to show the commitment and capacity required to cope with the academic content of the course.

Year two entry:

- HNC in Construction or Built Environment OR
- · Year 1 of an HND Quantity Surveying.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

HND (SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This course combines a broad based construction industry first year with a more specialist second year curriculum, teaching you the skills you need for employment in this highly demanding sector. Construction Managers supervise and direct operations on a construction project to make sure it is completed safely, on time and within budget.

Minimum entry requirements

Year one entry:

- Two Highers at Grade C or above, preferably including Maths or a Science OR
- A National Certificate in Built Environment or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant construction industry experience and the ability to show the commitment and capacity required to cope with the academic content of the course.

Year two entry:

- HNC in Construction Management
- Year 1 of an HND Construction Management.

COMPUTER AIDED ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY HND

(SCQF Level 8)

Course overview

This is a technician level qualification focusing on the use of Computer Aided Design software in construction and equipping you with the skills required for employment in this sector. An Architectural Technologist is a specialist in the technological aspects of building design and construction, bridging the gap between design theory and construction practice.

This is a two-year HND and will NOT accept direct entrants to Year 2 of the course in 2017/18.

Minimum entry requirements

- Two Highers at Grade C or above in Maths, English, Graphics, Product Design or a Science and at least three passes at a minimum of Standard Grade Level 3 or National 4 that include Maths, English and a Technical, ICT or Design related subject OR
- A National Certificate in Computer Aided Design & Technology or equivalent qualification at SCQF Level 6 OR
- Relevant experience or alternative qualifications will be considered. You should also have a sound knowledge and be competent users of ICT.

SHIPPING & MARITIME OPERATIONS NO

(SCQF Level 6)

Course overview

This course is for anyone looking to start their career in the Maritime Industry. It will introduce you to a range of topics and provide a background into how the Industry is regulated and the functions of the business ashore and at sea.

This is an ideal introduction if you want to work: at sea as a Deck Officer or as an Engineering Officer; in a ship management company; in port operations



There are a number of elements to the programme and also a compulsory sea time requirement of seven months. The programme is structured into five phases.

There are two main entries into this programme -September and January.

Minimum entry requirements

- Higher Maths and/or physical science at Grade C or above, and national 5/GCSE or equivalent which must include English, Maths, Physical Science (e.g. Physics, Chemistry, Technological Studies or Engineering Science) and one other subject
- NC Shipping and Maritime Operations (SCQF Level 6) with optional Engineering units
- Alternative qualifications will be considered on an individual basis in conjunction with the sponsoring company or training provider.

Students must have a sponsoring company in order to fulfil the sea time requirement of this programme. Initial applications for this course should be submitted to a training provider or company.

GENERAL INFORMATION

HOW TO APPLY



Applying to City of Glasgow College is easy. For courses starting in September online applications will open in January and for courses starting in January online applications will open in October.

Our course information pages tell you what the minimum entry requirements are for each course. Our admissions procedures aim to treat everyone who applies fairly so, if you meet the entry qualifications for the course, and we have places available, we'll offer you an interview. Our professional and supportive teaching staff will guide you through the interview process and selection will be based on your performance at interview and any other selection criteria where appropriate.

What if I'm applying for more than one course?

List your choices in order of preference - we'll start with your first choice when considering your application. If this is unsuccessful, or the course is full, we'll move on to your second choice. This gives everyone a better chance of securing their first choice course.

What if I can't apply online?

We can help you complete a paper application. You can call Student Services on 0141 375 5191 or alternatively, pop in to see us at our City Campus or email:

What happens when I apply?

When you apply online you'll be asked to complete a simple registration process to create your account. You'll need a current email and we'll use this to contact you throughout the admissions process. Once you've set this up, you can:

- Complete the application form
- · Book an interview date and time
- View your course choices
- Accept or decline any offers
- Pre Enrol

I've booked my interview what happens now?

You'll receive an email confirming the date, time and location, plus what you'll need to bring, e.g. a copy of your qualifications. For design courses, you might also be asked to bring a portfolio or examples of your work.

What else should I know about the interview?

We've only a limited number of places on each course and we only offer interview times if there are still places available. This means that you may need to wait for an interview date if we're still processing the outcomes of previous interviews.



Also because we make offers as we go along, the course might be full by the time you attend. If this happens we'll make every effort to let you know before you attend for interview. However, more interview dates sometimes become available if people don't turn up or do not accept their offer. Please bear this in mind - we'll progress your application in date order and as quickly as we can.

What happens next?

If you get a place on your first choice course, we'll automatically cancel your second choice to give others a chance. If your first choice course is full, we'll let you know and put you on the waiting list. We'll then progress to your second choice and let you know the decision on each choice. If both your choices are full, we may offer you an alternative course. Sometimes if a course is full and you've had a successful interview we may offer you a reserve place. This means that you're at the top of the list if someone else drops out.

So what should I do after receiving my offer?

Once you receive an offer, you must accept or decline within two weeks. If we don't hear from you, we'll cancel the offer. If you want to cancel or withdraw your application at any time, please contact Student Services on 0141 375 5191 or applications@cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk

When you accept your Definite Offer you can then Pre Enrol.

What if I change my mind?

If you no longer want your place, or want to change to another course area, contact us immediately. Please don't make any more applications - this may delay your progress.

How will I know if I'm not successful?

If you don't meet the entry requirements for a course, we'll let you know. We may offer you an alternative course, or invite you for an interview to discuss your options. If you meet the entry requirements but don't receive any offers, we'll also put you in touch with our Careers Advisors, who can advise you what to do next.

What if all my course choices are full?

If one of your course choices is full, we'll put you on the waiting list and progress your second choice. If all your course choices are full and you want to be considered for something else or need advice, please contact us.

Who should I speak to if I'm not sure about anything?

MONEY MATTERS

Most college students get financial support towards the cost of studying. For example most students do not have to pay course fees and many students receive support towards their living, travel, study and childcare expenses. The financial support you get depends on the level of course you study. The tables below show what you can apply for and who to contact.

FE FUNDING TABLE

Further Education (FE) Courses Level 6 or below on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework (see page 101)

Apply to the college for the following funding elements. Visit www.cityofglasgowcollege.ac.uk

Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) - 16-17 year olds can get £30 per week depending on household income (this will be based on your parent's earnings). EMA students will also be eligible to apply for travel from the bursary fund which is not based on your parent's earnings.

16-19 year olds on a part-time FE course can apply for EMA only based on your parent's earnings.

Childcare Fund Support - The priority groups for childcare support are lone parents and low income families (this can be evidenced by Working Tax Credits). Students studying full-time or part-time vocational programmes can apply. Support from the fund is discretionary and only open to eligible students to meet the costs of formal/registered childcare.

Help for Students with a Disability - If you need help because of a disability you may be eligible for additional support from the bursary fund e.g. help with the cost of private transport (taxi).

Further Education Bursary - This is the main source of help with living expenses, travel and study costs for those over 18 years old. This award is means tested (based on household income i.e. parental/spouse earnings) and how much you receive will also depend on your age and personal circumstances.

Further Education Hardship Fund - These funds can help you if you're likely to experience financial hardship at College. Funds are limited so you should apply early. Awards are based on an assessment of your income and expenditure and are made at the discretion of the college.

HE FUNDING TABLE

Higher Education (HE) Courses Level 7 or above on the Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework

Apply to the Student Awards Agency for Scotland for the following funding elements. Visit www.saas.gov.uk

Fees - Most Scottish students studying in Scotland don't need to pay tuition fees, but you'll need to apply to SAAS for them to be paid to the College. If you don't apply to SAAS or leave your course before 1st December you'll need to pay the fees yourself and the College will send you an invoice.

Independent Students Bursary - this is a grant of £875 for independent students where household income is below £17,000. You're considered independent if you're over 25 or if you're under 25 and have supported yourself financially for more than three years. It's based on household income and doesn't need to be paid back.

Disabled Students Allowance - if you have a disability, learning difficulty or mental health condition that impacts on your learning you could be eligible for additional help. This could be help towards the cost of special equipment, non-medical personal help or a basic allowance for learning support. If you think you're eligible contact our Learning Support Team.

Young Student Bursary - This is a grant of up to £1,875 for students under 25 where household income is below £34,000. It's based on your parent/guardian's income and doesn't need to be paid back.

Lone Parent Grant / Dependant Grant / Care Leavers **Grant -** these are additional grants and don't need to be paid back. If you're a lone parent or live with a dependant adult, SAAS can award an extra grant to help you. If you're a care leaver you could get help with accommodation costs during long holidays like the summer vacation.

Student Loan - You don't have to take out a Student Loan but it's the main source of living expenses for most students. You'll only repay the loan after you've left college or university and are earning more than £17,335.

Childcare Fund Support - The priority groups for childcare support are lone parents and low income families (this can be evidenced by Working Tax Credits). Students studying full-time or part-time vocational programmes can apply. Support from the fund is discretionary and only open to eligible students to meet the costs of formal/registered childcare. The childcare fund is cash limited and it is advisable to apply early to ensure funding is available.

Hardship Funds - These funds can help you if you're likely to experience financial hardship while at College. Funds are limited so you should apply early. Awards are based on an assessment of your income and expenditure and are made at the discretion of the college.

Support For Learning - In addition to the Disabled Students Allowance offered by SAAS the college can offer practical support with equipment, etc


HOW CAN THE COLLEGE SUPPORT ME?
