 to use your voice to communicate your ideas, thoughts, opinions and needs. (MacMillan Dictionary)

 'the process of building and sharing meaning through the use of verbal and non-verbal symbols, in a variety of contexts' (Chaney, iTESL Journal)

- Pronunciation (sounds, accent, stress, intonation)
- Register (formal/informal)
- Functional language for transactional communication
- Accuracy vs fluency
- Language (vocab + grammar)
- Listening
- Body language
- Turn taking




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
Example speaking activities:

Useful language

- Can you help me? / I need your help. / I have a problem.

How much will it cost?

- When can you come? / Could you
 - come today? / It's an emergency!

Tradesperson: Someone calls you with a home repair. Ask them what the problem is and answer their questions.


Useful language What seems to be the problem? / How can I help you? / What's the problem? I can fix that. / I can help you. It will cost ... / I need to see it before I can tell you how much it will cost. I can come tomorrow. / I can come next week. / I'm sorry, but I can't come today. I will come between 1pm and 6pm.
