

To register with a GP or Dentist in Greater Glasgow and Clyde: www.nhsggc.org.uk

Apply for Council Tax Exemption:

Register to Vote:

Apply for Housing Benefit if you're eligible: Check the Accommodation Guide for details.

Money

If you're a Scottish student at a further education college in Scotland, you usually don't pay fees. You can also receive help with the cost of studying, including living costs and childcare.

What you're entitled to will depend on:

- Where you live, i.e. your nationality and residency status
- Your course, e.g. above or below HNC level, full or part-time
- Your age
- Your personal circumstances, e.g. your household income, marital status, number of dependents

Some funding is based on the income available in your household. If you're under 25, this will be based on your guardians' income.

You'll need to apply for funding every year that you're attending College. You can find more information on the funding you might be entitled to here.



Student Discounts

Although you may not realise it, lots of deals and offers are available to you as a student, both in stores and online.

Many places offer this so don't be afraid to ask! Various high street stores, food chains and entertainment venues such as cinemas and theatres offer reasonable student discounts.

To make the most of your discount, sign up for a <u>NUS Extra Card</u>. For a small one-off fee, you will receive a card that will open up many more discounts to you.
