Shaping the Life and Work of the College

Representation on College Boards and Committees

The Student President, Ian Gilmour, and Vice President Social and Activities, Jamie-lee Gooding, continue as members of the College Board for 2016/17. They recently attended and participated in the board planning meetings in February 2017 at the Hilton, Glasgow.

The Student President, Vice President Diversity and Wellbeing and a number of Faculty Reps from across the college attended the Academic Board meeting in February 2017 held in the Students' Association at City Campus for the first time. The Vice President Learning and Teaching attends the Learning & Teaching Committee and members of the Student Executive are actively participating in various college working groups.

Regional Student Engagement

The Glasgow Colleges' Regional Student Executive is made up of the Presidential Teams of the 3 Glasgow colleges and has met four times this academic year – at least once at each college – City, Kelvin and Clyde.

Class Rep Training

CitySA has continued to employ Institutional Associate Trainers to deliver class rep training sessions in 2016-17. 4 current students, all experienced Class Reps, have been employed to deliver the sessions and undertook extensive training from sparqs at a training weekend in Dundee in August.

Training sessions for Block 2 took place between 30th January and 17th February across both campuses, at a variety of times. Specially tailored Class Rep Training was delivered for Apprentices, ESOL students and students with additional support needs. Over 300 class reps have been trained to date and CitySA plan to deliver more training sessions before the end of the academic year.

Big Student Elections 2017

For the third year in a row, CitySA participated in the Big Student Elections – a nationally coordinated series of student elections throughout Scotland. As part of the Glasgow region, we worked with Strathclyde University Students' Union, Glasgow Caledonian University Students' Association and University of the West of Scotland Students' Association. Our polls were open the same week, promotion was shared across the city and we held a successful joint results party at Strathclyde Union on Friday 10th March.

The 2017 Big Student Elections took place between 6th and 10th March. Continuing our upward trend of engagement in elections, they were the most successful elections to date with over XXXX students voting. There were 13 candidates for the 4 Presidential positions. 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Campaigns

CitySA have been working alongside NUS Scotland on the promotion of the national campaigns #SupportUs and United for Education – both looking at educational funding and the cost of living for students in Scotland and the UK. February 2017 saw thousands of students across Scotland lobbying their MSPs on a fair deal for students in the Scottish budget at Holyrood.

SA on Campus

CitySA are investing in their resources for SA on Campus, buying large display boards, hoodies and other promotional material in order to increase their visibility on around campus. This is in response to feedback from students in the Student Experience Strategy focus groups and questionnaire which indicated that students would like to see the Presidential Team and Student Executive members out and about more often. As part of the CitySA communications strategy, SA on Campus sessions have been themed each month to emphasis a relevant message.

Finance

The Students' Association budget has been confirmed as £30,000 for 2016/17.

The Students' Association Presidential Team and Student Executive have budgeted for the year, ringfencing allocated spend on identified areas of priority, as well as allowing for a general spend to react to student needs throughout the year.

The highest event spend to date was Freshers' at £3,454.01 (a saving of £1,476.21 from 2015/16) and the highest one-off spend comes from the annual affiliation fee to NUS at £4,494.02.

Value and Impact

Student Partnership Agreement

CitySA are working with the college and the national organisation for quality in Scotland, sparqs, in developing a Student Partnership Agreement (SPA) at City. SPAs are documents which set out how student engagement works at the college right now, what we want it to look like going forward and

how the SA and college will work together to achieve that over the lifetime of the document.

The first SPA meeting will take place on Tuesday 28th March 2017 and will be facilitated by sparqs, involving students, elected officers and senior college staff.
