What is the purpose of the policy?

The purpose of this Policy is to show the willingness of City of Glasgow College to safeguard children, young people and vulnerable adults who may be at risk of harm.

Who does it apply to?

This Policy applies to all staff, students, stakeholders, volunteers, agency workers and any other contractor/consultant who may work for the college.

What does it cover?

- The Legal responsibility we all must ensure a child or young person is safe
- The definitions of some key things like an adult or child being at risk
- The college's responsibility
- Your responsibility

What do I need to know?

This policy is here to protect you and your fellow students whilst at college. It is important for you to look out for your fellow students and if something doesn't seem right or if you have a concern about a fellow student's safety, then we need to hear from you. In the first instance please talk to your lecturer about any of your concerns.

It is also important not to let the fellow student know that you have concerns, all we need you to do is to let us know about those concerns and then we can work with the student and other agencies to ensure that they are safe.

If you are unsure at all, it is best to talk to us and we can try and help.

Who can I talk to?

If you have a concern that you would like to raise, then you can speak to:

- Your Lecturer or Academic Advisor
- Any member of college staff.
